It's easy to fall in love with all of the characters in this series and I highly recommend it. I would've given it 5 stars however, the author confused her characters throughout the story and it's a pattern I've been seeing more and more with some of my favorite authors. I don't appreciate being distracted from the story by having to stop and interpret who is really speaking or acting. One obvious example of this in the book is when Jody yells, "King! You care if Jase goes to your house for Jase?". It occurs less blatantly in other parts of the book and I just find it frustrating. It doesn't take away from the overall story which is why it gets 4 stars.

This episode is about young Jase, 20, who Jody helped out when Jase left the foster care system. The Kennedy brothers have each other and their extended family, that keeps getting bigger.
