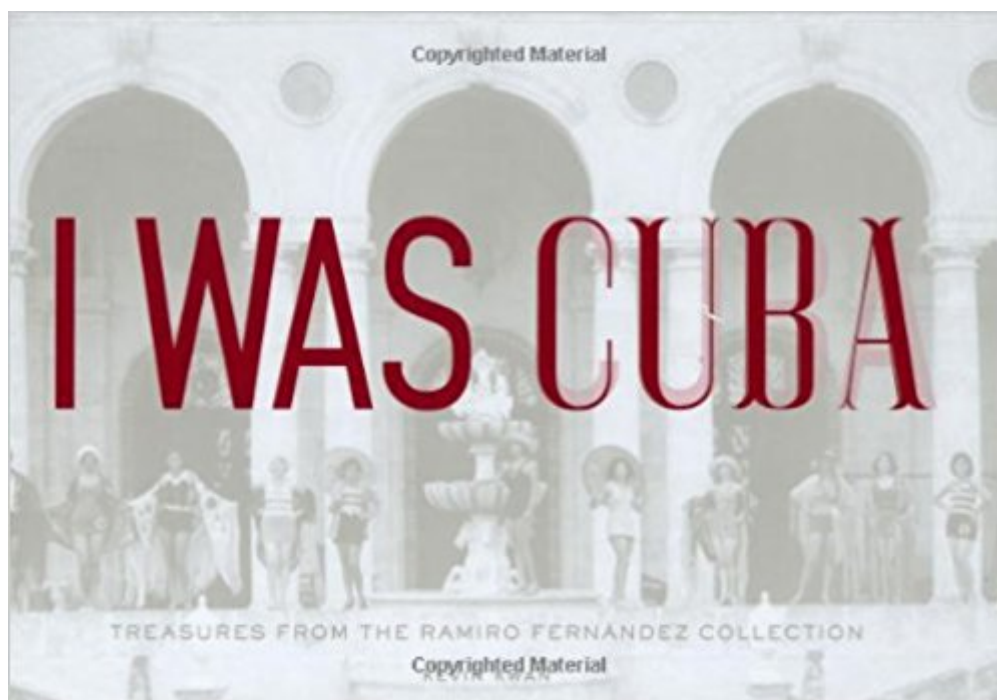


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I Was Cuba: Treasures From The Ramiro Fernandez Collection

Kevin Kwan creates books with some of the world's leading artists, designers and institutions. He has produced acclaimed visual books for Oprah Winfrey, Gore Vidal, David Rockwell and Elizabeth Taylor, to name a few. In 2004, he produced *Presenting Celia Cruz*, the celebrated photography tribute to Cuba's "Queen of Salsa." Peter Castro is the managing editor of *People Magazine*. Ramiro Fernandez was born in Havana to a family involved in the pharmaceutical industry. He left Cuba in 1960, settling first in Palm Beach County and then in New York, where he was a photography editor at Time Inc. for 25 years, working for such titles as *Entertainment Weekly*, *Sports Illustrated*, *People*, and *People En Español*. He is currently the Photography Director for *Americas Quarterly*. Fernandez first began to collect at the suggestion of his grandmother, who foresaw the coming turmoil and urged him to collect images of a Cuba that was fast disappearing.

As a witness to the revolution in his youth, Fernandez's consuming passion has been to build a collection that can serve as a testament to the Cuba he remembers.

They should have made the binding better for the book if you are not careful it can come off the spine somewhat even if new and packed right. There is a follow up to the book which I will add, Overall I wish there would have been Pictures of Grau and Prio but it is a collection from the Author/compiler.

Provocative photos from pre-1959 Cuba, which shows a glimpse of what life was there when it wasn't a prison camp. This is a good photo documentary that shows that Cuba was a beautiful and delightful country, not the Mafia run B-Movie that Hollywood so often portrays. This tidy little volume is worth much more than it costs. The nicely embossed cover has a "quality" feel, and the pictures deliver a unique experience. Anyway, he was delighted. This brilliantly chosen photo collection

illuminates a Cuba that no longer exists. The thing to remember is, the "lost" Cuba is not dead, just slumbering beneath the surface of the modern Communist state. The Cuban past caught in these pix explains a lot of the present reality; it may be VERY relevant to the near future, when Castro is gone and Cuba's mixed history and modern experience recombine.
