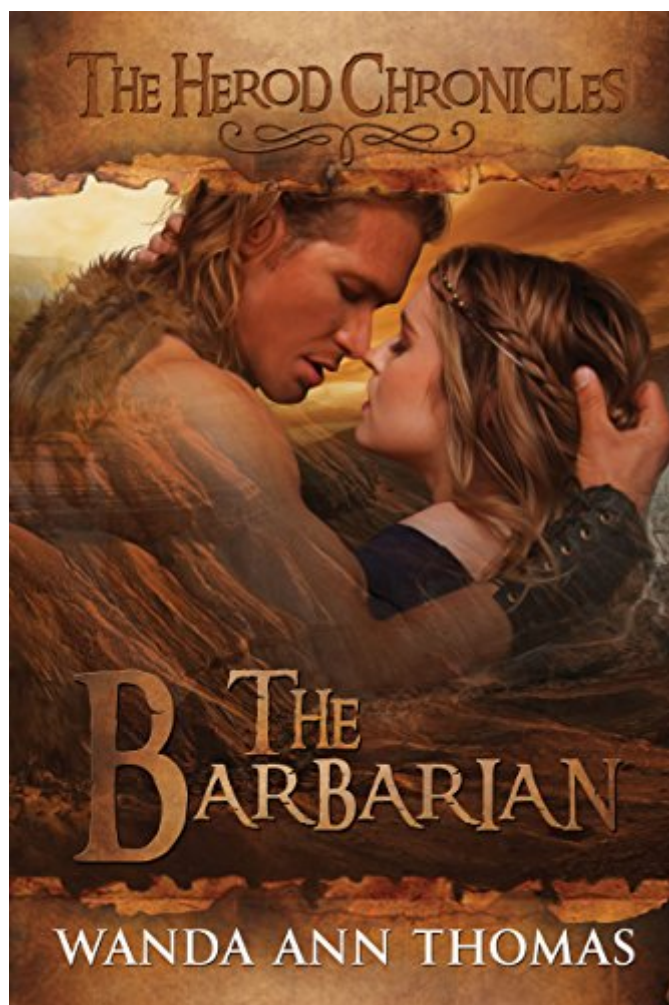

Once again, Wanda Thomas has delivered a high stakes, high paced story with a sweet romance. "The Barbarian" follows Thomas's gorgeous debut, "The Warrior," by continuing the story of the

Onias family of ancient Jerusalem, this time telling the story of Lydia and Kadar, the pagan fighter who rescued her in "The Warrior." A daughter of wealth and power but with no rights whatsoever, Lydia is heartbroken after her son is taken and given to her brutal late husband's family. She asks Kadar, for help in reuniting her with her infant son, but both are captured as they attempt escape her oppressive father's house. Kadar is enslaved, while Lydia is sent to a loveless marriage, setting events in motion that cannot be undone. Their destinies become entwined, as war rages in this ancient Biblical-era setting. Loyalties are tested, alliances are made and broken, and Lydia and Kadar both know there is no place in Jewish society for a high-born Jewish woman and a pagan barbarian from the north...Thomas does a beautiful job illuminating this ancient period. This book is fiction, but Thomas based her story on events of the time and brings it to vivid life while weaving an engrossing story. I'm already looking forward to the next book by this talented author.
