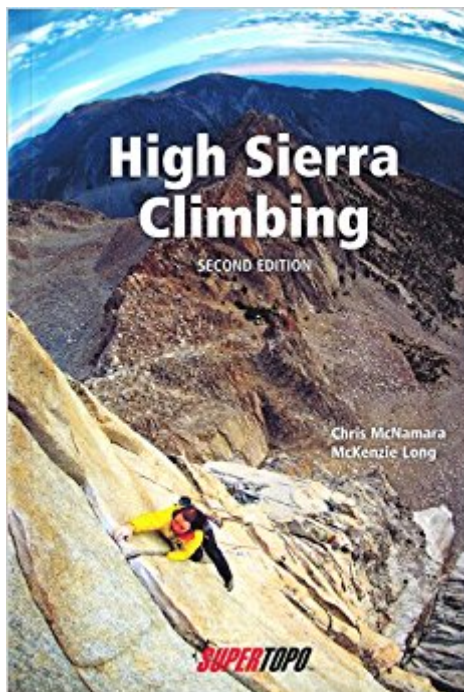

Many of the topos and route photos are so blurry that they are illegible and useless. Do yourself a favor and buy the digital copy on the Supertopo website. I just received this from and though it was a bootlegged copy when I saw the blurry topos. After reading some of the forum posts along with messages from Chris McNamara himself, I realized that this is a legit copy. I am a big fan of Supertopos and own several of your guidebooks for different areas. However, I am very disappointed with this book in its current condition. This is not the quality that I associate with Supertopo! UPDATE: I emailed Supertopo.com and they shipped me a guidebook that's not blurry free of charge. Apparently, only the first batch printed were blurry. So be careful where you buy these books from. Best to stick to buying from Supertopo and not random vendors on .
