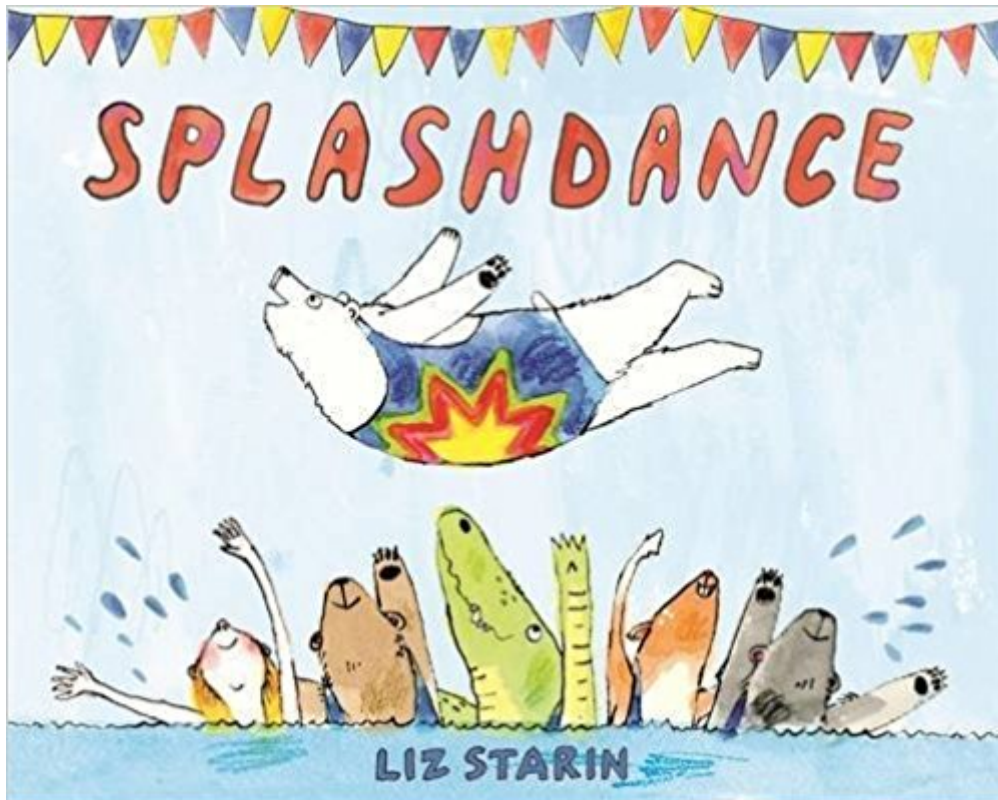




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Splashdance: A Picture Book

PreS-Gr 2 "Ursula, a polar bear, and her human friend, Ricardo, are set to enter a water ballet contest until a new rule bans bears from the pool. When Ursula shows up next day disguised as a rabbit, she discovers Ricardo has deserted her for a new partner. Although immersed in sadness, Ursula begins to practice her ballet moves in the neighborhood pond, where she meets a group of performers, including a brown bear named Ralph, who are also barred from the contest. Together they perfect their routine and hatch a plan. After all the contestants perform on the big day, Ricardo and his giraffe partner are declared winners. But they are overlooked when a chorus of

"Ready! Set! Go!" announces the unauthorized entrance of Ursula and her water ballet companions, who dazzle the audience with their "complicated routine" and Ursula's "triple banana flip" finale. Although they have not won this contest, Ralph assures Ursula they have indeed scored a victory, for a page turn reveals a new pool rule: "Everyone Welcome!" The watercolor and crayon illustrations greatly enrich the brief text and add many touches of humor, from the title page scene of bear and human enclosed in separate shower curtains to a list of such pool rules as "no frolicking; no lollygagging; [and] no filibustering." Ursula's rabbit costume and home furnishings as well as announcements on signs and T-shirts afford added chuckles. Alert readers can even check out the title on the rabbit lifeguard's book. VERDICT The message that loyalty and inclusiveness are important is a valuable one to share with children. This joyful story is told through language and illustrations that are at once playful and powerful. At times the plot is advanced seamlessly and engagingly through illustration alone, and readers will love noting all the quirky details that round out the setting and characters, like titles on a bookshelf, swimming paraphernalia, and the hilarious names of water ballet maneuvers. Children will root for the underdog team of animal water ballerinas restricted from the municipal pool on account of "No Bears Allowed!" and eagerly engage in discussion about topics ranging from frustration and fairness to segregation and inclusivity.

This is a fun and quirky book about inclusion. When Ursula, the polar bear, is no longer permitted to practice her water ballet at the community pool, she can't train for the water ballet contest with Ricardo. He gets a new partner. So, Ursula, after a week of crying, gets innovative and goes down to the pond where she swims with the other animals. They form a team. They don't win the million \$ prize for water ballet, but the team manages to take down the "No Bears" sign at the community pool. This book is a great way to talk about INCLUSION. One of our primary needs is a feeling of belonging, and this shows children how great it is to include folks so they belong. Illustrations look watercolorish, and are whimsical and fun.

One MILLION dollars! That is the prize awarded to the winners of the water ballet competition at the community pool. So Ricardo, a mustachioed, knobby-kneed gentleman and his water ballet partner Ursula, a well-groomed but furry polar bear practice their routine diligently. All at once, a new rule bans bears from the pool, and Ricardo summarily ditches Ursula for a new partner, a giraffe named Hortense. Ursula is devastated at the betrayal and heartbroken to lose her chance in the competition. After all, she really loves water ballet! Eventually Ursula dons a striped bikini and she sneaks down to the community pond for a quick dip. Alone, she executes her best double back albatross and half twist chanterelle in the weedy green swimming hole. Then one day Ursula arrives at the pond only to meet a large group of water ballet enthusiasts practicing their routine. They, too, were cast out of the pool due to their ursine members. This group - this TEAM - has stuck together and continued to practice. Ursula is inspired to join them, and she devises a plan to ensure that they can participate in the water ballet championship after all. Starin's text is smart, vibrant and playful. A balanced mixture of short and long sentences filled with cut-to-the-chase emotions keeps the storyline popping along. Young listeners will remain eager to turn the page and discover what happens next. Starin's illustrations are spectacularly funny, inventive and ridiculous, adding

implausible wacky details that appeal to the eye and the funnybone. Clever signs, wild bathing costumes, and a hilarious menagerie of swimming critters mix together to produce a divinely humorous tale. Ursula finally gets to perform her impressive triple banana flip in the water ballet competition “but will it be enough to win the million dollars? Or is there an even bigger prize at stake? Splashdance is a lighthearted, inspiring winner from beginning to end.
