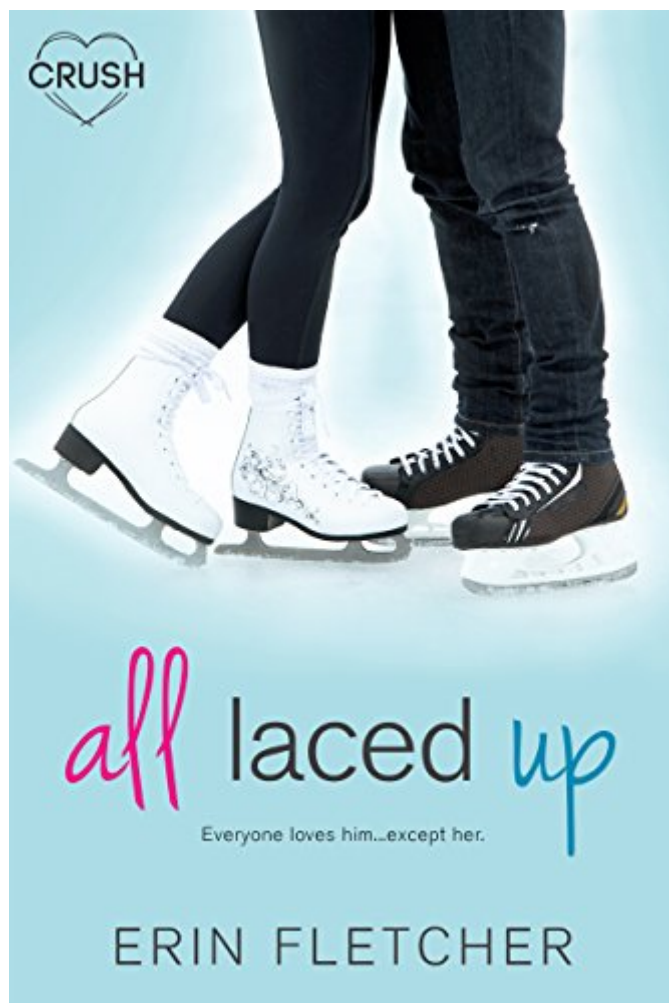




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All Laced Up

I wish Uncle Drew and Mr. Koslov had bigger parts in the story but that is just because I liked them so much. Really, I kind of wish all the secondary characters had bigger roles. It's not that they were lacking development but more that they clearly had things going on in their own lives that I would like to know more about. It would have been cool to learn more about why Robbie's girlfriend broke up with him, or why Uncle Drew was still single when he was clearly an awesome guy or what Embry was going through as she prepared for her concert. That's not a real complaint though. The story wasn't actually about them so I'll just have to use my imagination. My only real complaint was the problem concerning dual identities, online verses IRL. Both characters pretty much made a mountain out of a mole hill and seemed bent on misunderstanding each other without ever being clear or fully open with one another. Perhaps that is realistic because some teenagers tend to do that but that doesn't make it good book material. A little more actual conflict would have made for a better read. Still, I enjoyed reading it. If not for the central problem, then for the budding
