

Susan Branch is the American author of the 13 HEART OF THE HOME lifestyle books,

with over four million in print, all of them hand-written and watercolored ~ books about the home arts of cooking, gardening, homemaking, family, best friends, entertaining and the little things that make life sweet. Susan has now added a three-part series to her list, all of them illustrated memoirs filled with old photos, watercolors, quotes and recipes. The last in the series came first (in 2013): A FINE ROMANCE, Falling in Love with the English Countryside. The two prequels to that are, first: THE FAIRY TALE GIRL (pub date Oct. 2015, and then: MARTHA'S VINEYARD, ISLE of DREAMS (pub date May 2016). To celebrate the 30th year of her first book, Heart of the Home, it will be reprinted with an updated cover and 16 new pages and published in June 2016. Born and raised in Southern California, Susan followed her heart to the Island of Martha's Vineyard in her 30s, "unable to live any longer without four seasons and picket fences as everyday architecture." She shares her 1849 home with her two kitties, Jack and Girl, and Joe Hall, the person Susan calls "the man of her dreams." She writes a newsletter called "WILLARD," named for her grandfather, all about home, celebrations of the seasons, cooking, kitties, decorating, movies, books, art, and creativity. The art in her book delights the eye and her courage to keep going reminded me that some of us find our purpose in life when it's ready to show up and not before. I hated to see it end so I bought the 3rd book in the trilogy and will read slow enough to savor each page. Susan Branch's writing is funny, a bit innocent, yet brave. What an adventure her life has been. Keep writing, Susan. By hand, of course!

I didn't think I could like this book more than the first two (A Fine Romance and Fairy Tale Girl), but I did. Maybe because Branch relied heavily on her diaries for material, the reader can see her grow, mature, and finally realize her dreams. Branch is an interesting person, and this comes out in her stories. I liked that she shared her uncertainty, admitted to a few mistakes, acknowledged that some

things just seemed to happen while she went along with them. Branch's handwritten pages, watercolor paintings, carefully chosen quotations and photos are icing on the cake. I also enjoyed the high quality of the books. Branch created her own publishing company for the last two books and so could control all the details, resulting in a beautiful, hefty, delightful book. I've already given it as a gift, and will certainly read all three books again.

It reaches into your soul and dances on your heartstrings. A "memoir" that reads like a novel and like nothing you have read before.
