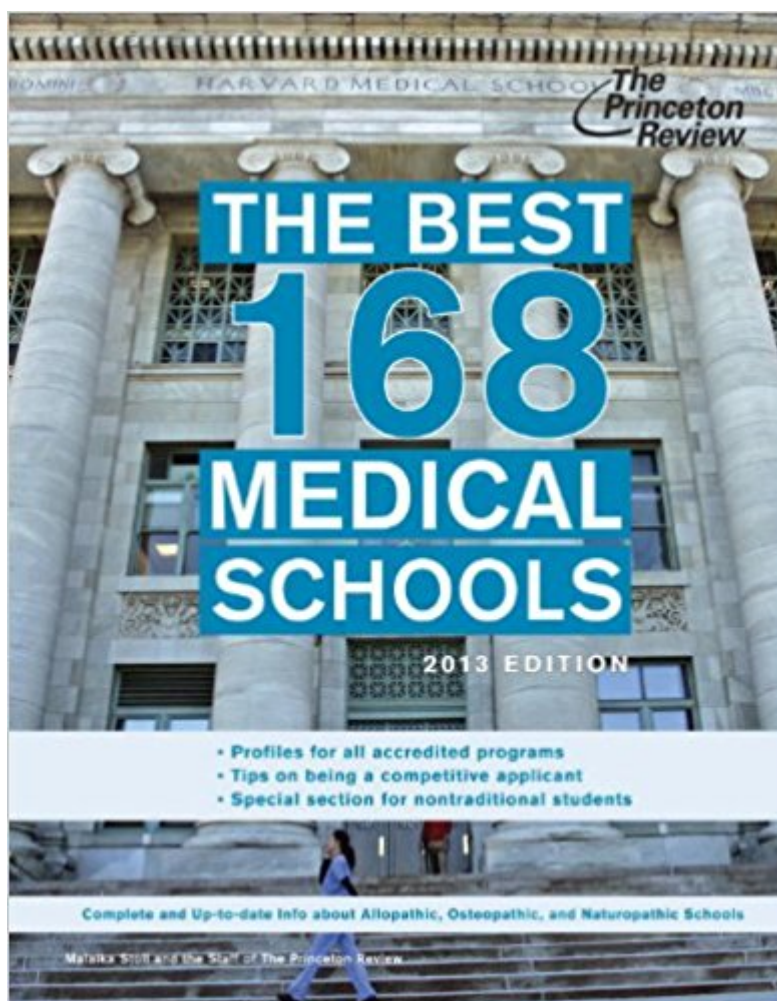

## Customer Reviews

I wrote to the editorial team, but I wanted to let other potential buyers know about some SERIOUS typos contained in this book:

Pages 222-223: Information supplied is for Uniformed Services University, NOT Tufts University. There is no other listing for Tufts.

Pages 368-369: Information supplied looks like it is for West Virginia University School of Medicine, NOT Washington University in St. Louis. There is no second listing for Washington University in St. Louis. This is one of the top

medical programs in the country, and should absolutely be listed properly. Pages 372-373: There is a second listing for West Virginia University School of Medicine, but it is unclear which pages provide the correct information for the school. Had I not been paying attention, I would have decided not to apply to some schools that are a good fit for me. Medical school applicants have enough to worry about, without having to deal with incorrect resources. I'm sure there are more mistakes than I have found here, so I am no longer going to use this book. It's completely useless.

The Best 168 Medical Schools book was not that useful to me. I had the same year's MSAR (Medical School Admission Requirements) and the MSAR was 10x more useful in terms of information and browsing. I am not kidding, save yourself time and money and just get the MSAR instead. The Best 168 Medical Schools book simply doesn't have enough information in it to justify buying it. Some of the schools listed in it have the MCAT/GPA scores and tuition costs and others do not. Ummm, talk about incomplete. The MSAR has all information for every single school, not just 168, and it also has more information that pre-med students should be looking at, even if they don't know it yet. For example, residency matches, out of state accepted percentages, etc...

If you have no idea on where you want to go, this is a good starting point. You'll want to research the school websites directly and talk to live people as well, but the book is a great way to identify schools to research further.

Horrible book. A lot of inaccurate information. Example: on page 377 the book states "Yale does not participate in AMCAS." which is false!
