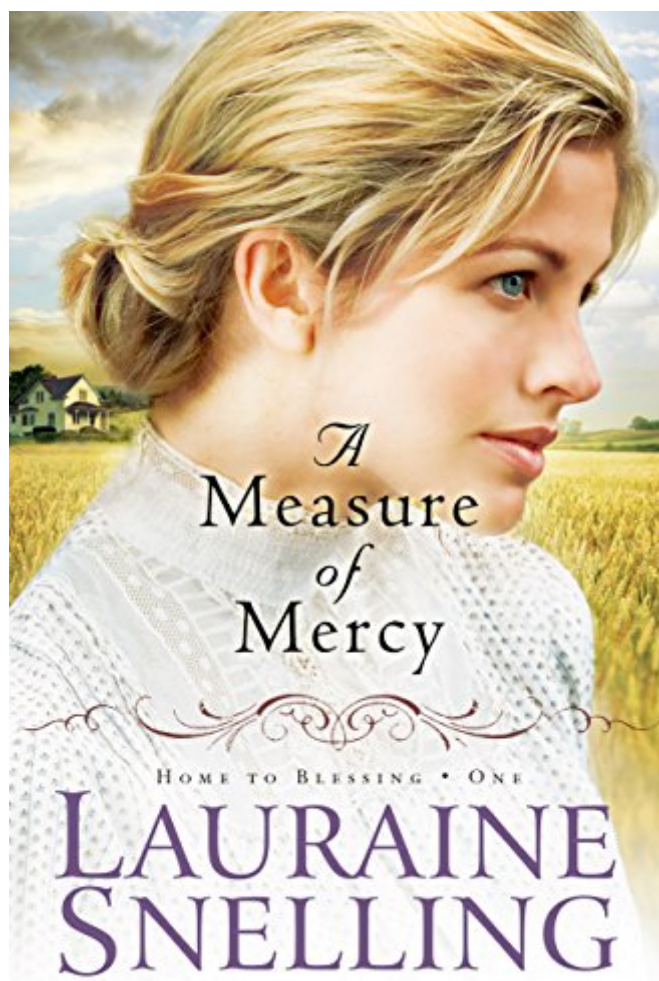


The book was found

Lauraine Snelling couldn't write a bad book if she tried. Every time I think the last book was my favorite, I read the next in her series and fall in love all over again. She's a prolific writer and full of charisma. I love her style and that she is a Christian writer. You don't have to worry about cuss

words or scenes you don't want to read about. I am reading her second book right now and it's really good. Just when I think I've figured out what's going to happen, she changes directions on me. That's good! I highly recommend her books starting with the first one. Beware, if you do, you'll end up getting them all and reading them. You just can't stop. They should make a series out of this series of books. They are that good.

Ms. Snelling has written 50 or more books, but this one surprised me in what, to me, came across as less than a stellar novel. I enjoyed the theme of the book-small North Dakota town in 1903 with an in-training doctor, Astrid Bjorklund, and her doctor sister-in-law who run a clinic. Astrid can't decide if she should go off for 6 months to Chicago to train at a medical school or stay home and continue her work at the clinic. Before she can decide she 1) meets a man who's running from his past in Iowa and 2) she hears a missionary talk at church about the medical needs in Africa. What should she do? She ends up going to Chicago; her man, Joshua, returns to Iowa; she decides to go to missionary training in Georgia. The book ends as she sits on the train waiting for it to leave. And . . .? And, you have to get the next book in the series to find out what happens next. I learned a lot about small town farm life and even more about medical school in the early 20th century. What tripped me up was all the names of the Norwegians in town. I couldn't pronounce them nor remember who they all were. When it came to barn dances or holidays I skimmed over the numerous character names: Ingeborg, whose granddaughter was Inga-why would you have two such similar names in a novel? Her husband Haaken, son Thorliff, someone named Trygff. I also tired of the lengthy prayers contained in the book. I got this free on my Kindle

When I read the last page, I was left feeling someone should have had mercy on the reader. Other reviewers have discussed multiple story lines being thin and distracting, which I tend to agree with. The real disappointment for me came with the abrupt ending. It felt as though the author intended to write more but suddenly changed her mind and just gave up. Astrid's decision made no sense whatsoever based on the rest of the story. There appeared to be no defining point or clear reason for the decision. It was so abrupt in fact, when I got to the end, I actually expected to see a plug for a sequel. Did the author chop the book in two and save the rest for a sequel? After some investigating, it seems that there is a sequel, but I won't give my time to it, based on the nonsensical ending of this novel. Perhaps material was edited out. After investing so much time in the story, I was truly disappointed and unfulfilled in the way the story was resolved. If I were the author, I'd take all those loose ends, write an extension of this novel that would do justice to the characters, and make the ending fulfilling and worthwhile for the reader.

I have three major criticisms with this book: First of all, if you have not read the other series that this one seems to come from, there are far too many characters. I don't know why I should be invested in every single person in this town because there is so little character development with any of them. Secondly, as a missionary, I found the entire "calling" of Astrid to have been done very poorly. As God leads a person to serve Him overseas, He continues to confirm it. The idea that she is going kicking and screaming with little time for prayer and focused time in God's Word seemed ridiculous. Also, not saying goodbye to your family? I was incredibly disappointed in that storyline. Thirdly, (SPOILER ALERT) the book didn't have a clear resolution. It just said, the adventure continues. Well, that's nice if I want to pay for another book. I generally enjoy Christian fiction as a relaxing break from my day, but this book honestly frustrated me.

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
