Can you even imagine being caught in a blizzard? I can, I lived in snow country in the north. However these pioneers didn't even have a home that was fitted out to protect them from the weather. They didn't have a proper barn for the animals even if they could get to them. This storm hit so suddenly Rosette barely had time to get herself and her granddaughter in the cabin. Rosette's son DeWitt and his wife were caught out in it, and she was close to having her baby. Would they

make it to town? Would they turn back to the cabin or perish in the blizzard? To find out please read the book, I found it very interesting, tense, a story worth reading.

Cindy Rinaman Marsch's "Blizzard" sets a new standard in survival stories. Experience the intimacy of a tight-knit family amidst a natural disaster, with all the lyricism and physicality interwoven. The gorgeous, detailed prose is worthy of Jack London or Hemingway and will evoke the same emotions as "To Build a Fire" and "Old Man and the Sea". This is the opposite of formulaic "survival" stories. This could also be turned into a short art-house film.

What a fascinating story of life in the Dakota Territory in the late 1800's. The story concerning the Blizzard is quick, fast, and dangerous. The story about the Churchill family during the Blizzard is so intense that the reader will find that this is a page turner that is worth the read.

You can almost feel the wind and snow pouring into the little soddy house on the Dakota prairie. This short book gives only a little taste of the Children's Blizzard of 1888 when so many, mostly children, died in the snowstorm that caught so many unprepared. These people were pioneers who had suffered through many severe storms but were nonetheless lulled by the mild morning and were quickly overcome by the speed at which the weather changed into a terrible blizzard.

Cindy Rinaman Marsch totally conveyed the courage of the homesteaders, and the Interior of the shanty with its meager supplies. Any book that can get my mind so engaged in the story that I'm still pondering the "what ifs" a day later, as this short tale did, is a well written and enthralling story. I highly recommend The Blizzard, by Cindy Rinaman Marsch.
