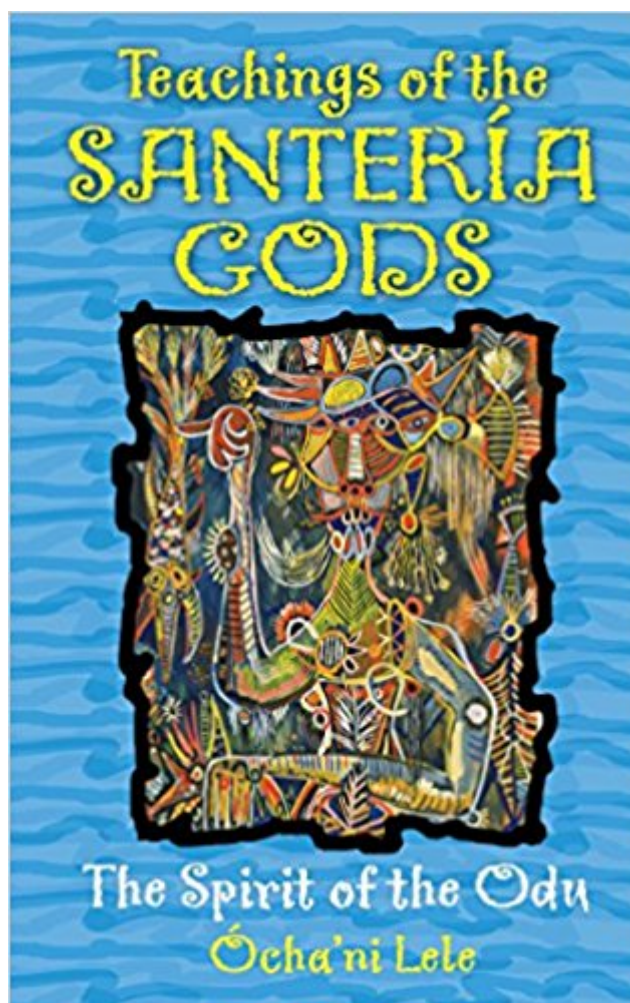


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Teachings Of The Santería Gods: The Spirit Of The Odu

He lives in Winter Park, Florida.

There are so few reputable authors when it comes to Santeria. As an Aborisha I can personally attest that this author is not only an initiate of a verified Ile, but is also an Elder in the community. If you are interested in studying this beautiful religion, then I certainly recommend his books. However, if you feel the call to worship the Orishas, you must remember that this is NOT a solitary or pagan practice. You must find a competent godparent who will serve as your initiator.

This was a very good read that helped me to understand a part of this great belief system that I am very interested in becoming an adherent to. I would highly recommend this book to anyone who would like to be transported into the life and times of the Orishas.

Ocha'ni Lele did a wonderful job of retelling many of the tales of the Odu during their lives on earth. So many followers of the Lucumi faith only focus on the main Orisha and I think often forget about the lesser deities and even the important Odu individually. The author was able to handcraft an assortment of various stories on each one, maintaining some of the tribal, primitive elements while modernizing the stories all at the same time - making for a wonderful preservation of the Yoruba patakÃ-. I expect this book to be one handed down as a learning tool to each person who is to learn the ways of the religion in addition to learning the system of diloggun divination.
